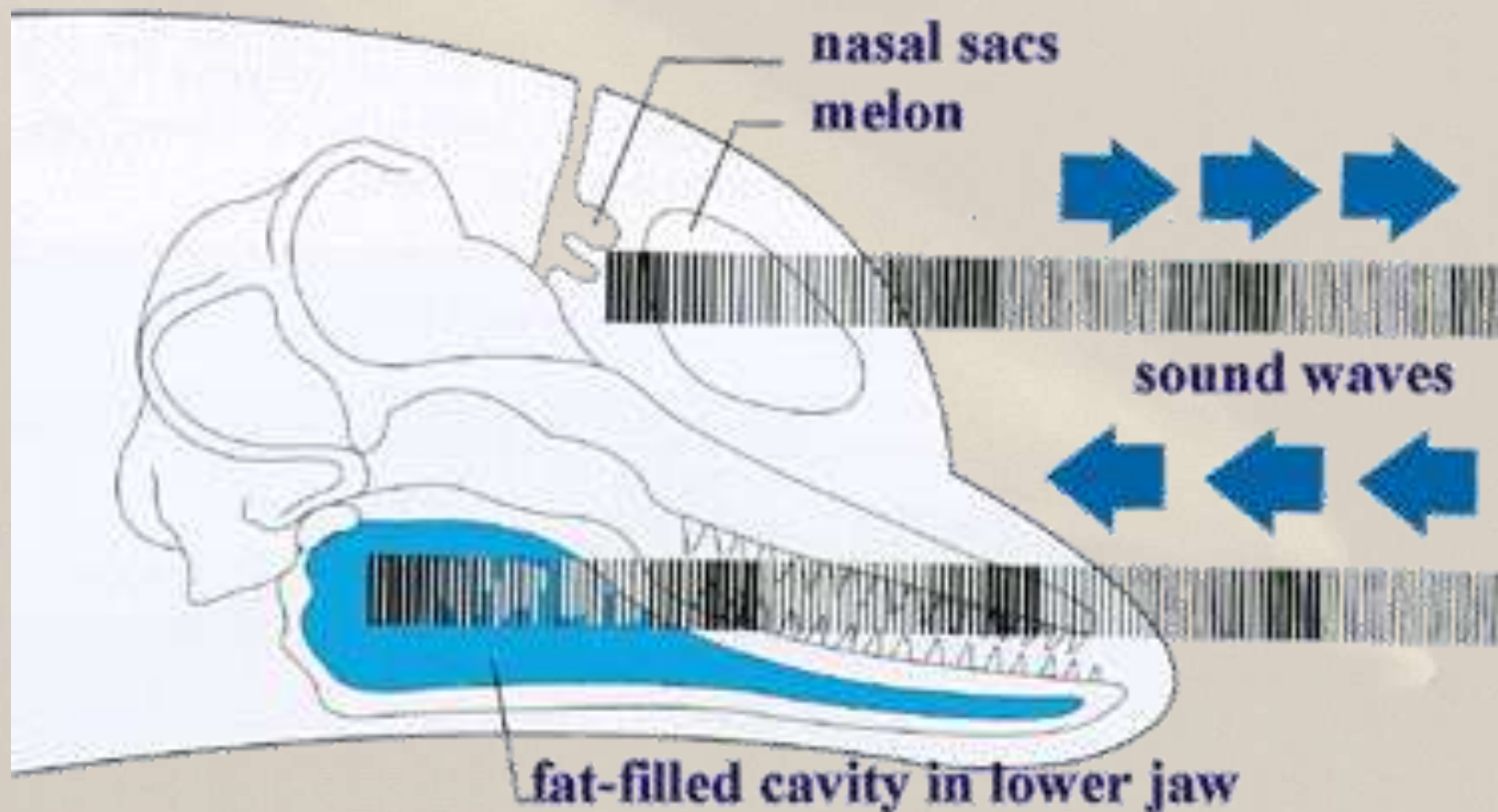

Code of Conduct

- Don't chase the dolphins or drive your boat directly towards them
- If you wish to approach the dolphins, do it very slowly, keeping parallel to their course, avoid sudden changes of direction or speed.
- The motor should be maintained in neutral or switched off, let them approach you.
- Don't make sudden noises, especially with the engine as these could alarm the animals.
- Ensure that only one boat is within 60m of the dolphins, or three boats within 100m.
- Don't stay with the dolphins for more than 30 minutes
- For your safety and theirs avoid swimming with them, never offer them food or touch them.
- Leave the area accelerating gradually when the boat is more than 100m from the animals
- Don't throw litter overboard, plastic bags can be swallowed by the dolphins.

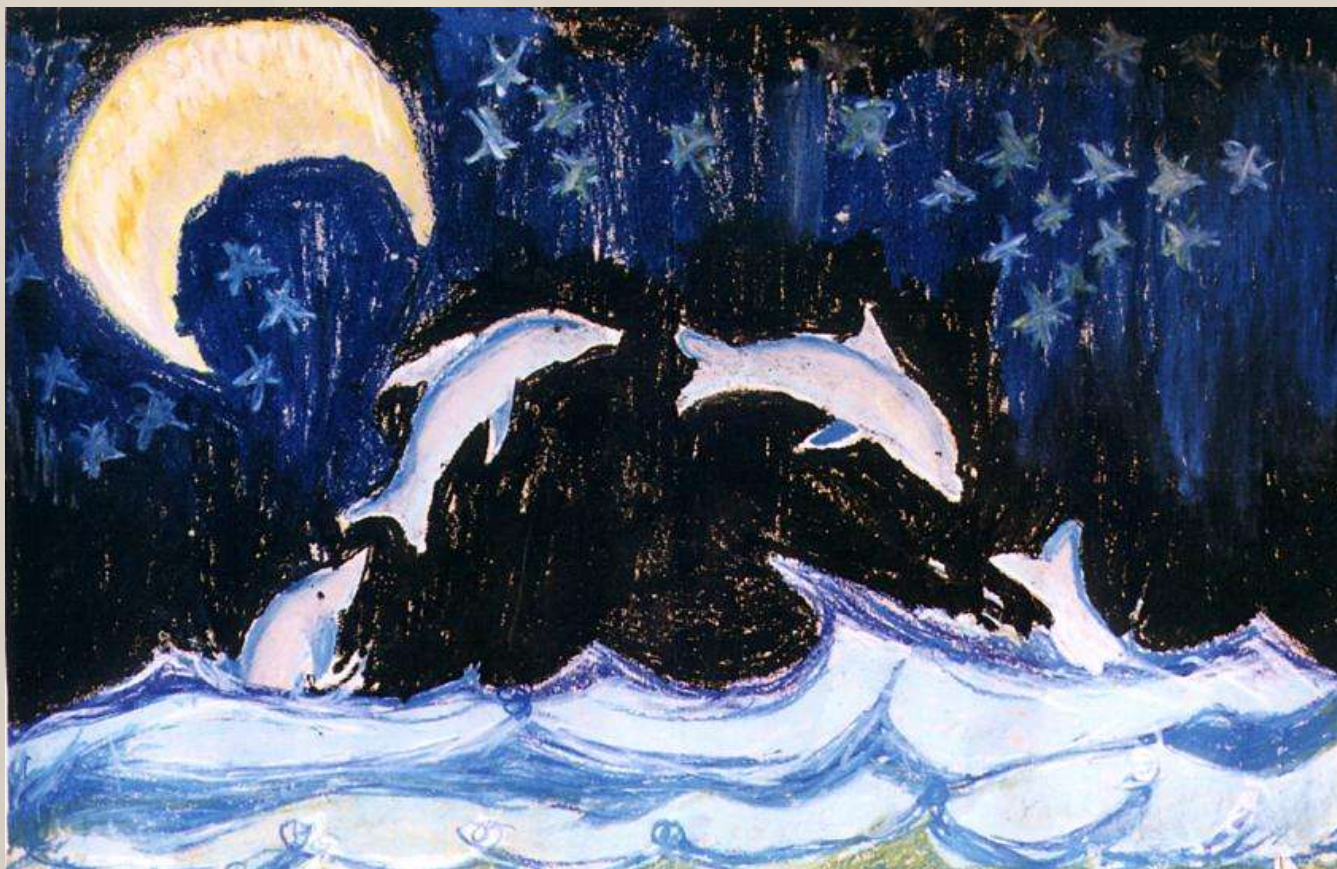

He has a large impressive body, but is also very agile and amazingly friendly to our researchers. He is famous for his hunting abilities and will often bring large fish, up to 80cm long, to the surface to show us. There seems to be a strong bond between Phil and Monk, however unlike Monk he is often in the middle of a group showing off his size and agility. He is often found in the southern part of our study area, particularly around the islands of Cres, Orijula, Dab, Silba and Premuda. BK, Greg and Mida are among his preferred companions.
